I. Readings etc.

This course covers some of the work of Gottlob Frege, G.E. Moore, Bertrand Russell, Ludwig Wittgenstein, A.J. Ayer, and W.V.O. Quine. We will read Scott Soames's *Philosophical Analysis in the Twentieth Century*, vol. 1 (*The Dawn of Analysis*) (Princeton, NJ: Princeton University Press, 2003). In addition, we will read primary sources, which will be made available to you as necessary. A tentative schedule will be posted and periodically updated on the course webpage. You will be expected to have done the readings before class and to bring the relevant texts with you.

II. Requirements

Option (A): three short papers (3-5 pages each), each worth 33.3% of the final grade.

Option (B): one long paper (10-15 pages), worth 100% of the final grade.

I will announce topics for the short papers on a more or less weekly basis. Short papers will be due on the Monday after they are announced.

If you write a long paper, I must approve your topic. In addition, you will be required to meet with me at least twice during the semester: once, by the end of Week 7 (i.e. 27 February 2004), to discuss your topic; and again, by the end of Week 12 (i.e. 2 April 2004), to discuss your progress. The long paper is due one week and one day after the last class, i.e. by 5 PM on Tuesday, 13 April 2004.

III. A Warning about Academic Dishonesty

It is difficult to overstate the importance of academic honesty. If you are unsure about what counts as academic dishonesty (e.g. plagiarism) or about how to cite sources, ask.
