Course description

This is an idiosyncratic course in metaphysics from 1891 to late last night. We will address the admittedly elusive question of whether, in addition to different kinds of *beings* (e.g. sticks, stones, tables, chairs, persons), there are different kinds of *being* (e.g. existence, subsistence, concept-existence, object-existence). In addition, we will address the question of whether any entities have no kind of being whatsoever.

Readings

We will read work by Gottlob Frege, Alexius Meinong, and Bertrand Russell. We will also read work about Martin Heidegger and David Lewis. Many of the readings will be available electronically through Carmen. A schedule will be posted and updated on the course webpage (which is not on Carmen).

The first assignment will probably be a short problem set. (If not, it will be a short paper.) The second assignment will be a short paper (3-5 pages). The final
